




The Botanical Natural monument of national importance, protected by State since 1968.

1,432 km length avenue with 187 individs 250 years old oaks, *Quercus robur* tree high up to 35 m, girth - up to 4.25 m

Nature and landscape protection system




Objects of Heritage are the objects of natural and cultural heritage which could be soliter or form dense groups, these are valuable elements of landscape granted the special protection and use regime by legal acts. The most valuable of these are granted Natural or Cultural Monument status.

Botanical natural heritage objects include trees, bushes which are of **outstanding age, dimensions, forms or are dendrologically and aesthetically valuable**, also it could be origin sites/ habitats of protected flora and fungi species, unique and vanishing flora communities, dendrological collections, dendrologically valuable parks and squares.

Objects of Natural Heritage in Lithuania could have National or Regional protection status: protected by State or protected by Region. These are of **individual objects**





In 2022, there were 701 natural heritage objects in Lithuania, of which 155 are exceptional natural monuments.

469 protected by the state, 232- by municipalities.

62.2% of all protected objects are botanical but only 25 (17.5%) in that number have the status of a Monument.

Tree avenue - the ONLY 1

Botanical Natural Monument of national importance - Vidkiemis village Oaks Avenue, protected by State since 1968.



There are ONLY!!! protected Trees avenues in :

5 oaks (*Quercus robur*) and 6 lime trees (*Tilia cordata sin.*). The State protects 6, Regional authorities - 5.

At the state level, alleys were declared protected in 1968, 2005, 2007, 2012, 2016.










Cultural heritage objects - individual, complex or complex objects, registered as immovable cultural assets, i.e. i.e. buildings or other immovable objects located on land plots, parts of plots, water, forest areas or their parts, which have valuable properties and together with the territory assigned to them are separate objects of real property rights or can be such.

Trees avenues are not individual objects, but components or properties of individual CH objects and sites

Almost all XVIII-XIX cnt. parks have trees avenues or their fragments, but trees avenues are considering not as the individual valuable objects, but as the properties, the constituent parts of the cultural site, complex

At the beginning of XX cnt., there were about 4000 manor homesteads in the territory of present-day Lithuania.

The survey of 1989-1993 indicated <u>823</u> manor homesteads Édouard François André


In 2018 - 579 such objects of National Register of Immovable cultural heritage Among the there are 32 parks of National importance with special historical, architectural, cultural, scientific, <u>aesthetic</u>, ecological and dendrological value (state property)




The ensemble of the **Traku Vokė manor homestead** with historical buildings, a park, alleys, and ponds was formed in the XIXth century.



2023 10 13 Kaunas Municipality:

"25 lime trees of critical condition will be removed and replaced by at least 10 year-old trees at least 6-8 meters high and at least 45-55 cm in diameter. These works are planned to be carried out this fall or next spring.

"Even before the reconstruction of avenue, about a 1/3 of linden trees were affected by chronic diseases. "It was decided to save long-lived trees as much as possible and to replace only those in critical condition with new ones, - the chairman of the Lithuanian Society of Dendrologists Arvydas Rutkauskas."





Tree avenues near the roads



Tree avenues are the landmarks of traditional Lithuanian landscape

Tree avenues are historical relics of previous political and administrative divisions, legal norms of land management of different states and rulers, they are associated with the roads and settlements network, remind us land ownership, possession borders.

They leed us to homesteads and manors, which are now extinct.



Tree avenues are the landmarks of traditional Lithuanian landscape

Historically tree avenues were

- element of representative, wealth and recognition
- artistic tool to focus eye, mind and movement to the significant objects churches, chapels, manors, entrances etc.
- help indicate paved roads tracks in flooding areas
- landmark in war periods
- prevent winds and give shade in agricultural lowlands



Traditional land management and traditional landscape

Western part of LT - Mažoji Lietuva, Prussian rule Northern part of LT - Teutonic influence Sauthern part of LT - Užnemunė, Prussian rule

UŽNEMUNĖ 1795-1807 after the Third Partition of the <u>Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth</u>, Sūduva (also part of Poland with Warsaw) went to <u>Prussia</u>, it was called Užnemunė, part of <u>New East Prussia</u>. 1807-1815 belonged to the Duchy of Warsaw, 1815-1915. For the <u>Kingdom of Poland</u> (in the Russian Empire). 1816-1837 was in Augustava Voivodeship, 1837-1867. — in Augustava province, and in 1867-1915 entered the Suwalki Governorate, as a result of the 20th century In the 1st half, it started to be called Suvalkija.

1808-1840 The Napoleonic Code was in force in Užemunė.



Traditional land management and traditional landscape

LT - the part of Russia Empire:

From 1795 until the First World War, when in 1915 Lithuania was occupied by Germany, the greater part of Lithuania was annexed to the Russian Empire, and Užnemunė to Prussia.




Traditional land management and tree avenues landscape

Western part of LT - Mažoji Lietuva with Memel,

Prussian rule from 1773 to 1829 and again from 1878 (with the Kingdom itself being part of the German Empire from 1871); following World War I it formed part of the Weimar Republic's Free State of Prussia, until 1945.

On behalf of the Entente in 1920-1923, the French army was there.

Memel and Lithuania minor joined the Lithuania country in 1923.

Eastern part of LT - Vilnija, Polish rule in 1919-1939




Tree avenues are the landmarks of traditional Lithuanian landscape

- 2) introducted in Russian Empire poplar (*Populus*) also planted in soviet time
- 3) nowadays other species




